PROPOSED ORDINANCE 168

AN ORDINANCE VACATING CERTAIN OF THE STREETS AND ALLEYS OF THE CITY OF GOLDEN, COUNTY OF JEFFERSON, AND STATE OF COLORADO.

BE IT ORDAINED, by the City Council of the City of Golden, in the County of Jefferson, and State of Colorado:


That all of the streets and alleys contained and situated within that portion of the City of Golden described and limited as follows, to-wit: Beginning at the point of intersection of the Southerly boundary line of 11th Street with the West boundary line of the original plat of the City of Golden, thence north-easterly, along said southerly boundary line of 11th Street, to the westerly line of Birch Street, thence southeasterly, along said westerly line of Birch Street, to the Southerly line of 12th Street, thence Northeasterly, along the Southerly line of 12th Street, to the Westerly line of Elm Street, thence south-easterly, along the Westerly line of Elm Street, to the South line of the original plat of the City of Golden, thence West, along said South line, to the Southwest corner of said original plat, and thence North, along the West line of said Original plat, to the point of beginning, be and the same are, and each and every part and portion thereof is, hereby vacated and abolished as public streets, alleys and thoroughfares of the City of Golden, reserving, however, to the City of Golden, the right, privilege and authority of laying, constructing and maintaining sewer lines, water lines and power and light lines in any and all of said vacated streets and alleys.



The Clerk reported that Mr. Fred Nichols, of Evergreen Lumber Company was in regarding some berylebearing land on Golden Water shed, and which he reserved the right to mine in the agreement he had with the City of Golden when he traded the land to the City.
