

563. Section 2. That the fee of said portions of said Sixteenth and Birch streets hereby vacated, and all right, title or interest of the City of Golden or its inhabitants or the public therein, or of the state of Colorado or its inhabitants therein, shall be deemed and taken to vest in said The Rubey Clay Company, the owner of the lands abutting on said portions of said streets hereby vacated, as provided by law.

ORDINANCE NO. 116

(Passed March 5, 1926.)

Vacating Portion of Jackson and Water Streets and Alley.

564. Section 1. That all that portion of Water Street extending easterly between blocks numbered 33 and 38 on the North Side of Clear Creek, from the easterly line of Washington Avenue to the westerly line of Jackson street; and all that portion of Jackson street extending southerly, between blocks 37 and 38, on the north side of Clear Creek, from the southerly line of Water Street to the north bank of Clear Creek; and all of the southwesterly half of the intersection of Water and Jackson Streets; more particularly described as that portion of said intersection lying south and west of a line drawn diagonally from the point of intersection of the northerly line of Water Street with the westerly line of Jackson Street to the point of intersection of the southerly line of Water Street with the easterly line of Jackson Street; and all of the alley contained within Block 33, on the North Side of Clear Creek; all in the City of Golden, County of Jefferson and State of Colorado, be and each and every part and portion thereof is hereby vacated and abolished."

ORDINANCE NO. 120

(Passed July 16, 1926.)

Vacating Portion of Seventh and Ford Streets

565. Section 1. That all of that portion of Seventh Street, in the City of Golden, and State of Colorado, lying between blocks fifteen and sixteen in North Golden, and extending from the easterly line of Ford street in said City to the Westerly line of East Street in said City, and also the easterly ten feet of Ford Street, in said City, extending from the southerly line of Seventh Street to the northerly line of Eighth, being a strip 10 feet wide and 300 feet long, be and the same hereby are vacated.

566. Section 2. That the fee of said vacated portions of Seventh and Ford Streets and all of the right, title and interest of the City of Golden and of its inhabitants, and of the public therein, or of the state of Colorado, or the inhabitants thereof, therein, shall be deemed and taken to vest, and the same hereby is vested, in said Adolph Coors Company, The Colorado and Southern Railway Company, and Ashley Bussert, the owners of the lots and lands abutting on said portions of said streets hereby vacated, as their rights may appear, as provided by law.
