

**ORDINANCE NO. 311**

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 3 OF ORDINANCE NO. 47.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GOLDEN, COLORADO:

Section 1. That Section 3 of Ordinance No. 47 of the City of Golden, Colorado, be amended to read as follows:

Section 3. Any person or persons being the proprietor or keeper of any public billiard table, pool table, pigeon hole table, or any table on which any game of skill or chance is played, bowling alley, shooting gallery or card game, within this city, who shall permit any person under the age of sixteen (16) years to frequent, or to be in or about the same, or to engage in any game of billiards, pool or any game, in or about such place, shall upon conviction thereof, be fined in a sum not less than ten dollars nor more than one hundred dollars for each offense, or by imprisonment not exceeding ninety days, or both such fine and imprisonment, in the discretion of the court.
