

CHAPTER VIII.

Concerning Canals, Ditches and Mill Races.

ORDINANCE NO. 10

(Town Ordinance 1877, Chapter IX, General Sections 94 and 95,
Compiled Ordinances 1900.)

136. Section 1. That the owner or owners of any canal, ditch or mill race now completed or to be completed within the limits of the City of Golden shall be, and they are hereby required, wherever any such canal, ditch or mill race crosses any of the streets or alleys of said city which are opened and traveled by the public, to construct a good, secure bridge across such canal, ditch or mill race the whole width of such street or alley so opened and traveled by the public, with a good hand rail on each side of such bridge wherever the lots on the side of such bridge are not fenced; such bridge to be approved by the supervisor of streets of said city, and the owner or owners of such ditch, canal or mill race shall at all times keep such bridge or bridges in good repair.

137. Section 2. It shall be the duty of the supervisor of streets to notify the president or secretary of any such canal, ditch or mill race, wherever such bridges are necessary to be built or repaired; and if the president or secretary of any such canal, ditch or mill race shall neglect or refuse to construct or repair such bridge or bridges within ten days after the giving of such notice, then it shall be the duty of the supervisor of streets to construct or repair such bridge or bridges, as the case may be, and the owner or owners of such canal, ditch or mill race shall be liable for the expense of such construction or repairs, together with a penalty of not less than five (5) dollars, nor more than twenty (20) dollars, to be collected as other fines and penalties for the breach of any ordinance.

CHAPTER IX.

Relating to and Governing the Installation of Electric Wiring and Appliances
in the City of Golden, Colorado, and Creating the Office
of Electrical Inspector.

ORDINANCE NO. 50

(Passed March 6, 1909.)

138. Section 1. There is hereby created the office of electrical inspector, who shall be appointed by the City Council and who shall be a competent and disinterested electrician, and his term of office shall be subject to the pleasure of the Council. His salary shall be the fees collected under this ordinance, and it shall be his duty to inspect all manner of electrical work in the City of Golden so that it will conform with this ordinance; and he shall have the right to enter upon any premises at all reasonable hours for the purpose of making said inspections.

139. Section 2. All wiring construction and installation of appliances shall be in accordance with the latest edition of the National Electrical Code, being rules and requirements for the installation of electric wiring and apparatus for electric heat, power and light, as the same are now established and shall not be approved until same is safeguarded against undue and unsafe voltage rise by proper grounding of service wire. When such installation shall conform to the above the electrical inspector shall issue his certificate of approval, and no current shall be turned on said installation until such certificate shall have been issued.

140. Section 3. Any person refusing, neglecting or failing to install wiring and appliances in accordance with this ordinance shall be judged guilty of a misdemeanor, and shall be fined not less than \$10.00 nor more than \$100.00 for each offense.

141. Section 4. This ordinance shall not be construed to relieve from responsibility any person owning, operating or installing electric wiring or appliances for damages to persons or property by any defects in such wires or appliances, nor shall the City of Golden or any agent thereof be held as assuming any such liability by reason of inspection and permit herein authorized.

142. Section 5. The electrical inspector is authorized to have service disconnected from such wiring installations as may, in his judgment, be hazardous to property or life, such wiring not to be again connected to service until brought into accordance with the requirements of this ordinance.

143. Section 6. The electrical inspector shall charge for inspection of wiring as follows: \$1.00 for final inspection and issuance of certificate; 50 cents for each additional inspection necessary for concealed wiring.

144. Section 7. It shall be a misdemeanor for any person to change, alter or add to any existing wiring until permit for such changes, alterations or additions shall have been obtained from the electrical inspector.

CHAPTER X.

Concerning Finance and Taxes.

ORDINANCE NO. 21

(Passed September 1, 1919.)

145. Section 1. The fiscal year of the City of Golden shall begin on the first day of April in each year.

146. Section 2. It shall be the duty of the city clerk in each year, and as soon as may be after the assessment roll of the county of Jefferson shall have been completed for the current year in regard to the list and valuation of the property subject to city taxes, to ascertain from such assessment roll and certify to the City Council the total valuation of said property; whereupon the City Council shall, by resolution, levy the necessary taxes for city purposes for the current year, and shall specify in such resolution the different kinds of taxes and for what purpose levied, and the rate of each kind, as well as the total rate for the whole of such taxes; and the city clerk shall immediately thereafter certify to the county clerk of said county a copy of such resolution in order that the said city taxes may be extended in the proper list, and warrant for the collection of taxes, in pursuance of law.

147. Section 3. The county treasurer shall on the second and fourth Monday of each and every month, pay over to the city treasurer all monies so by him collected on the city taxes upon the presentation to him of an order signed by the mayor and the city clerk.

148. Section 4. The city treasurer shall immediately, upon any payment to him made, as provided in the foregoing section, apportion the money so paid to the several funds, in accordance with the original levy, and credit the same to the appropriate funds.

149. Section 5. No account or claim against the city, except claims for the salary of city officers, shall be allowed unless the same shall be made
