

delinquent taxes are by him collected, by advertisement and sale of the property charged therewith, or otherwise, as provided by law. Redemption from sales made hereunder may be made in the same manner as redemption from tax sales. Said money, when collected, less fees due the county treasurer and the costs of collection, shall be, by the county treasurer paid over to the city treasurer, as provided by section "3" of chapter "X" compiled ordinances of 1920. When said moneys are collected and paid over to the city treasurer, the same shall be credited to that fund of the city from which the money shall have been drawn for sidewalk purposes, as aforesaid.

483. Section 13. Said amount may also be recovered by the city of Golden or its assigns against any such owner or owners of the property abutting said improvement and against which said assessment is made in any court of law at any time after the expiration of thirty days from and after the date of the completion of any such assessment.

484. Section 14. If any section, clause or phrase of this ordinance is, for any reason, held to be invalid, such invalidity shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this ordinance. The City Council hereby declares that it would have passed this ordinance, and each section, sentence, clause and phrase thereof, irrespective of the fact that any one or more other sections, sentences, clauses or phrases be declared invalid.

485. Section 15. In the opinion of the City Council, this ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, welfare and safety, and it shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and final publication.

#### ORDINANCE NO. 27

(Passed September 4, 1882.)

486. Section 1. That a sidewalk be constructed on the north side of Second street in the said City of Golden from Jackson street to Washington Avenue, in conformity to the ordinance relating to sidewalks, except that said sidewalk shall be of the width of twelve feet.

Note: Second street mentioned in above section is now Twelfth street.

487. Section 2. That permission and authority be and is hereby granted to Michael Schall, the owner of the hotel building on lots 8 and 9 in block three on the south side of Clear creek, and fronting on Second street (now Twelfth street) in said city, to construct a cellar or vault under the sidewalk in front of said premises to the extent of four feet beyond the line of said lots, and authority is also hereby granted to said Schall to construct a stairway leading to the basement of said building, extending from and under said sidewalk of a width not exceeding four feet, said basement entrance to be guarded by a railing, as provided by ordinance.

#### ORDINANCE NO. 36

(Passed December 5, 1899.)

488. Section 1. No person shall ride a bicycle or tricycle, or push or draw a handcar or wheelbarrow along and upon any sidewalk or crosswalk situate on any street or avenue within the limits of this city.

489. Section 2. No person shall coast, slide, skate or ride, whether by
