

ORDINANCE NO. 1025

AN ORDINANCE REPEALING CHAPTER 4.48 OF THE GOLDEN REVISED ORDINANCES OF 1965 RELATING TO HANDBILLS AND ADVERTISING DISTRIBUTION AND ENACTING NUISANCE PROVISIONS OF THE GOLDEN REVISED ORDINANCES OF 1965 RELATING TO HANDBILLS, POSTERS AND PLACARDS AND PRESCRIBING A PENALTY FOR VIOLATION THEREOF

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GOLDEN, COLORADO

Section 1. Chapter 4.48 of the Golden Revised Ordinances of 1965 relating to handbills and advertising distribution is hereby repealed.

Section 2. Section 5.20.325 of the Golden Revised Ordinances of 1965 is hereby enacted, as follows:

"5.20.325 Handbills, Posters and Placards. (a) It is unlawful and a nuisance for any handbill, poster, placard, or painted or printed matter to be glued, stapled or nailed to or upon any public or private dwelling, store, other building, fence, power pole, telephone pole, or other structure, or lawful sign without the permission of the owner or occupant of such property.

(b) It is unlawful and a nuisance for any handbill, poster, placard, or painted or printed matter to be placed upon or fixed or attached to any private passenger automobile without the permission of the owner of such automobile, provided, however, that this sub-section (b) shall not apply to the service of any city citation or summons or complaint.

(c) It is unlawful and a nuisance for any handbill, poster, placard, or painted or printed matter to be deposited or distributed within the City upon public or private premises without having been delivered to the receiver thereof and which has not been secured and prevented from being blown or driven about.

(d) It is unlawful and a nuisance for any person to throw, deposit or distribute any handbill, poster, placard, or painted or printed matter upon a private premises, if requested by anyone thereon not to do so or if there is placed on the premises in a conspicuous location near the entrance thereof, a sign bearing the words "No Trespassing", "No Solicitors", "No Advertisement", or any similar notice indicating in any manner that the occupants of said premises do not desire to have their right of privacy disturbed or to have any such handbill, poster, placard, or painted or printed material left on such premises.

Section 3. Any person violating any provision of this ordinance shall be subject to those penalties as prescribed in Section 1.01.110 of the Golden Revised Ordinances of 1965.

Section 4. Any ordinances or portions of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.
