

ORDINANCE NO. 201

AN ORDINANCE TERMED THE ANNUAL APPROPRIATION BILL FOR THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING MARCH 31, 1944.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GOLDEN, That the Fiscal year ending the 31st day of March, A. D. 1944, the following sums of money, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby appropriated to defray the expenses and liabilities of the City of Golden, to-wit:

FIRST: Fifteen Thousand Dollars to provide for sinking funds, for the payment of the outstanding bonds of said City.

SECOND: Five Thousand Two Hundred Forty Three and 56/100 Dollars, to pay the interest on the outstanding bonds of said City.

THIRD: Twelve Thousand Seven Hundred Eighty and no/100 Dollars, to pay salaries and compensations of the officers of said City.

FOURTH: Eleven Thousand One Hundred and no/100 Dollars, to construct and keep in repair the Streets, Alleys, and Bridges, of said City, together with Culverts, Sidewalks and Cross-walks. The total sum to be spent in the following manner:

A. Six Thousand Six Hundred Dollars for Street maintenance.

B. Four Thousand Five Hundred Dollars for repairing pavement.

FIFTH: Seven Thousand and no/100 Dollars, to pay the Water expenses of said City, not otherwise provided for.

SIXTH: Four Thousand Seven Hundred Fifty and no/100 Dollars, to pay the General and Incidental expenses of said City, not otherwise provided for.

SEVENTH: Three Thousand and no/100 Dollars, to pay the expenses of the Police and Fire Departments of said City, as follows:

Fire Department	\$ 650.00
Sinking fund for fire truck	750.00
Police Department	1600.00

EIGHTH: One Thousand Fifty

and no/100 Dollars, to pay the expenses of the Golden Park and Cemetery of said City.

NINTH: Eighteen Hundred Dollars, to pay the expenses of lighting the Streets of said City.

TENTH: One Hundred Fifty and no/100 Dollars, to pay the expenses of re-creation of said City.

ELEVENTH: There is hereby appropriated, for use during the fiscal year ending March 31, 1944, from the sewer fund created by Ordinances number 191 and 192 the sum of Two Thousand Dollars.

WHEREAS, in the opinion of the City Council, an emergency exists, and this ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, therefore this ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon the expiration of five days after its final passage and publication.
