

out in separate items, and the nature of each item stated, and the same shall be verified by the affidavit of the claimant, his agent or attorney, in which affidavit it shall be stated in substance that the said account is just and due, and that neither the same nor any part thereof hath been paid.

**ORDINANCE NO. 148**

(Passed August 11, 1936.)

150. Section 1. For the purpose of defraying the corporate expenses and liabilities of the City of Golden, the following funds are established, to-wit:

- A—Water Works Fund
- B—Fire and Police Fund
- C—Street Lighting Fund
- D—Street and Alley Fund
- E—Salary Fund
- F—General and Incidental Fund.

151. Section 2. A—All of the ordinary construction, maintenance, repair and operating expenses of the municipal water works system shall be paid out of the Water Works Fund.

B—All of the ordinary expenses of the Fire and Police departments, including the purchase, repair and replacement of equipment, shall be paid out of the Fire and Police Fund.

C—All costs and expenses for street and alley lighting shall be paid out of the Street Lighting Fund.

D—All ordinary expenses for the construction, maintenance, repair and upkeep of streets, alleys, bridges, and culverts shall be paid out of the Street and Alley Fund.

E—All salaries and other compensations, except wages, of all city and department officials and employees shall be paid out of the Salary Fund.

F—All municipal expenses of every kind and nature, whatsoever, not hereinabove specifically provided for, including special expenses of the Water, Fire and Police departments, and for Streets and Alleys, Street Lighting and Salaries, shall be paid out of the General and Incidental Fund.

152. Section 3. All moneys derived, by the city from the taxation of property located within its corporate limits shall be apportioned among said various funds in accordance with the respective levies or appropriations made for said funds, as provided by Ordinance No. 21, Chapter X Revised Ordinances of the City of Golden, of 1921.

153. Section 4. All revenue received, by the City of Golden, from any and all sources, except taxation, and all unexpended balances of appropriations, shall be deposited in and transferred and credited to an account to be known as the Contingent and Residuary Account and, from time to time, the city council shall and may transfer the moneys in said account to the various funds of the city for the purpose of meeting and satisfying the various appropriations made therefor.

154. Section 5. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

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
