## ORDINANCE NO. 298

AN ORDINANCE VACATING A PORTION OF THE ALLEY IN BLOCK SEVENTEEN (17) ON THE NORTH SIDE OF CLEAR CREEK IN THE CITY OF GOLDEN.
BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GOLDEN, COLORADO:
