

AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO WATER METER RATES FOR THE CITY OF GOLDEN, AND FIXING CERTAIN RATES AND CHARGES FOR SAID SERVICES.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GOLDEN, COLORADO:

Section 1. That from and after thirty days after the final passage and publication of this ordinance, unless further time be granted by the City Council, meters shall be installed and used for the measurement of all water thereafter supplied by the Water Works System of the City of Golden, and for all purposes outside the city.

Section 2. That the meters required to be installed by this ordinance shall be such only as shall be authorized by the City Council, and such installation shall be made by or under the direction of the superintendent of water.

Section 3. The following quarterly rates, for water used and measured within the city by meter under the provisions of this ordinance shall be as follows, to-wit:

RESIDENCES. \$25.00 is for Residence and one lot.

Minimum—Winter—4,000 Gals. per month—or 12,000 Gals. from Oct. 1 to Jan. 1.

Minimum—Winter—4,000 Gals. per month—or 12,000 Gals. from Jan. 1 to Apr. 1.

Minimum—Summer—25,000 Gals. per month—or 75,000 Gals. from Apr. 1 to July 1.

Minimum—Summer—25,000 Gals. per month—or 75,000 Gals. from July 1 to Oct. 1.

For additional Lots of Irrigation \$12.50 per Lot or \$0.25 for a half Lot.

The amount allowed for one Lot of Irrigation is to be 21,000 gallons per month, or 63,000 gallons per quarter period from Apr. 1 to July 1, and from July 1 to Oct. 1.

The amount allowed for a half Lot of Irrigation is to be 10,500 gallons per month, or 31,500 Gallons per quarter period.

The charge for all over the minimum shall be .17c per 1,000 gallons.

For the purpose of this ordinance, the term "Lot" shall be construed to mean a plot 50 x 140 or 7,000 square feet; the terms ½ lot and fractional lot, shall be construed to mean a plot of 3,500 square feet or less.

APARTMENTS, HOTELS, ROOMING HOUSES, RESTAURANTS, ALL BUSINESS HOUSES, SCHOOLS, INSTITUTIONS AND INDUSTRIAL CONCERNS. \$25.00

Minimum—Winter—4,000 Gals. per month—or 12,000 Gals. from Oct. to Jan.

Minimum—Winter—4,000 Gals. per month—or 12,000 Gals. from Jan. to Apr.

Minimum—Summer—25,000 Gals. per month—or 75,000 Gals. from Apr. to July.

Minimum—Summer—25,000 Gals. per month—or 75,000 Gals. from July to Oct.

The charges for all over the minimum shall be as follows:

25c per thousand for first 50,000 Gallons.

20c per thousand for next 50,000 Gallons.

15c per thousand for all over 100,000 Gallons.

FOR STRAIGHT IRRIGATION
\$12.50 per Lot—

Minimum—Summer—21,000 Gals. per month or 63,000 Gals. from Apr. to July.

Minimum—Summer—21,000 Gals. per month or 63,000 Gals. from July to Oct.

\$6.25 for ½ Lot—Anything less than ½ lot will be considered ½ lot: Minimum—Summer—10,500 Gals. per month or 31,500 Gals. from Apr. to July.

Minimum—Summer—10,500 Gals. per month or 31,500 Gals. from July to Oct.

Provided, however, that in no case shall the charge for water supplied and measured by meter as provided by this ordinance be less than \$25.00 per year for household domestic and industrial use and \$12.50 for irrigation purposes.

And provided further that the rate and charge for the use of water from the said Water Works System for all purposes outside the City limits shall be and the same is hereby fixed at double the rate for similar uses and service within the city limits.

And further provided, that the City Council shall require a good and sufficient bond from the users last above described in such sum as it may from time to time require to secure the payment thereof.

Section 4. That the meter rates as provided in this ordinance shall be paid quarterly, and if not paid within thirty days after the same shall become due and payable, the water service shall be discontinued; and whenever said service shall be discontinued, it shall not be resumed at such premises until the amount of such arrearage shall have been paid in full, together with one dollar in addition as a service charge.

Section 5. The superintendent of water and his assistants in the discharge of his or their duties under this ordinance and for any and all purposes concerning the administration of the water system of the city shall be authorized to enter upon any and all premises to which water is, or is to be supplied, by the city.

Section 6. That ordinances numbers 77 and 119 and all other ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.
