## A RESOLUTION OF THE GOLDEN CITY COUNCIL TO CONTINUE THE CONSULTING AGREEMENT WITH RINGLE, BOYLE AND WEIST

WHEREAS, the Golden City Council unanimously agrees that their top priority for 2004 will continue to be protecting the City from those who wish to build a six-lane beltway along the  $6^{th}$  and 93 Corridor; and

WHEREAS, the City of Golden in 2003 assembled an outstanding team of specialists and consultants to help the City in this effort; and

WHEREAS, Patrick Boyle and Jeff Weist of the firm Ringel, Boyle & Weist have been an important part of that team and provided tangible and effective assistance to the City of Golden; and

WHEREAS, Ringel, Boyle & Weist recognize that their services in 2004 should be less than what was needed in 2003 and have lowered their retainer fee accordingly.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GOLDEN, COLORADO:

- Section 1. The City of Golden will continue to employ Ringel, Boyle & Weist as policy strategists and advisors for a 2004 retainer of \$15,000.00.
- Section 2. The City Manager is authorized to increase that retainer to \$25,000.00 if activity in the 2004 legislative session requires substantial additional work by this firm.
- Section 3. The Golden City Council expresses its appreciation to Ringle, Boyle and Weist for their excellent work this past year.
