

RESOLUTION NO. 1509

**A RESOLUTION OF THE GOLDEN CITY COUNCIL TO
CONTINUE THE CONSULTING AGREEMENT WITH RINGEL,
BOYLE AND WEIST**

WHEREAS, the Golden City Council has established its highest priority to protect Golden from the proposed six-lane beltway or toll road along the Highway 6 and 93 Corridor; and

WHEREAS, there are many powerful interests in the State of Colorado that wish to build this beltway to encourage unrestrained growth north and east of Golden; and

WHEREAS, there are no studies showing a transportation need for this beltway or toll road; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has assembled a team of expert consultants to help protect Golden;
and

WHEREAS, the policy strategist firm of Ringel, Boyle & Weist has provided invaluable help for 2003 and 2004; and

WHEREAS, both the City and Ringel, Boyle and Weist wish to continue this partnership at least through 2005.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GOLDEN,
COLORADO:


Section 1. The Golden City Manager is authorized to continue the City's contract with Ringel, Boyle and Weist Policy Strategists, Inc. throughout 2005 at an estimated cost of \$25,000.


